BIG JUMP TO VARSITY; COACH GONELLA CONFIDENT

This fall Terra Nova fields its first team playing official Peninsula League football. Also during the fall the Cross Country team will run its first official season and the 110's and 120's Basketball teams will compete in fall league competition.

The football team won 5 and lost 3 last year, playing mainly junior varsity teams. This year it will play all varsity teams and Coach Gonella feels this is such a big jump from J.V. ball that the players may be jittery and unsure of themselves for the first few games, but should settle down and surprise some of the teams that they play later on in the season.

At the time of this writing Coach Gonella felt that the team was at least a week behind schedule in its practice, mainly because only a few players came out for practice the week before school started.

Some players that Coach Gonella rates highly are Manuel Fick, Dennis Caruthers, Jim Boyette, Tom Swinger, Bob Pettit, Don Watson, and Henry Anduza.

In general, Coach Gonella hopes for a good season and at least a few wins.

Terra Nova's first Fresh-Soph football team is quite naturally inexperienced as yet, but their Coach, Al Figone, thinks they can

overcome this deficit if they work hard and continue to be hustlers, as they have thus far shown themselves to be.

Their first league game is with Westmoor on Oct. 12th.

The Cross Country team finished off with an impressive won 9 lost 4 record last year in the J.V. class and Coach Lanterman looks for great things out of returning lettermen Jim Beeler, Dan Vincent, and Steve Little, as well as some new talent out for cross country for the first time this year.

Dan Vincent, it should be mentioned, holds the Terra Nova school record for the fastest time thus far and also holds the Sophomore South City Memorial Stadium record, which is a real achievement considering the high caliber of runners that have competed there over the years.

Lightweight (110's and 120's) basketball, the 110's coached by Frank Lawler and the 120's by Richard Burt, has been quite handicapped because of the lack of facilities at Terra Nova at present. Nevertheless, the players have begun practicing at the Shary Park School Gymnasium and have yearly shown a desire to work hard at improving their game.
