### **NEXT YEAR'S 40-YEAR REUNION**

**--Cruise?** Thoughts so far are to have our regular reunion plan, a picnic and dinner/dance, but also to take another stab at arranging for a week-long cruise to Mexico, the Caribbean or Alaska. It looks like the Caribbean may be the least expensive. If we do this, we will have to have the picnic and dinner/dance on Saturday so that those who going on the cruise can get to their departure point on Sunday. That limits us to cruises that depart on Sunday or Monday. We would love to have some feedback on this whole idea to get an idea of just how many

people would be interested if they have 10 – 12 months to plan for it (so start saving your money now, just in case!). Sherry Lenci will be doing the research and booking of the cruise because she is our very own travel agent and is a cruise specialist.

--**Picnic and Dinner/Dance?** Please, also send us any ideas you have for the picnic and dinner/dance. The more ideas we have before we meet, the more productive our meeting will be. We are thinking that it would be nice this time to have a real catered sit down dinner with enough seating for all, but we would definitely have to raise the price more than if we just did a cocktail party with heavy hors d'oeuvres again. We think there wasn't enough food last time, but that was a result of trying to keep the price down. I've never heard of another group that charges less than we do, so we think a raise in ticket price would be worth the result. In 1995, the charge for the dinner/dance was \$30 each, but \$60 to \$80 would be much more reasonable for a nice dinner, rental of a room, and perhaps some nice background music (instead of dance music which requires space for dancing and a larger place to rent, especially since it seems that most people just want to sit and talk).

There is no place in Pacifica that we know of which is bigger than the Lighthouse Hotel, where we were for the last reunion.
